# The Maple Leaf

## Worth the wait! The Heart of Lakes Trail route through Maplewood State Park construction begins.


The early stages of construction of the Maplewood segment of the Heart of the Lakes Trail have begun with trail corridor marking and survey work, equipment placement, and some initial brushing and tree removal along the 3.8-mile trail construction corridor.

After an intense study by multiple stakeholders, the route through the Park was approved in early spring. The Maplewood trail, which connects the Pelican and Perham segments of the HOL Trail, is the last section needed to complete the thirty-two-mile trail. Most of the ten-foot-wide trail was completed in 2022.

A standout feature of the trail is its mesmerizing natural environment, and protecting that natural environment was part of the challenge in the approval process. "Otter Tail County worked closely with our partners in the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to create

a corridor that not only provided the most visually appealing trail connection through the State Park but to create a trail corridor that minimized the impact to the environment and habitat ecosystems within the Park," said Kevin Fellbaum, Parks and Trails Director of Otter Tail County.

Sections of the HOL Trail are open to the public, with the Maplewood segment expected to be completed in late 2024. The trail is intended for walkers, joggers, hikers, bicyclists, dog walkers, and inline skating. During the spring, summer, and fall seasons, motorized vehicles will be prohibited except for use by maintenance personnel and law enforcement activities. During winter, snowmobiling is permitted along specific segments of the trail corridor.

However, the new multi-use trail is not

intended for horseback riders. "Horseback riders will continue to have their own trail corridors through the State Park," said Fellbaum. "Those segments of horse trail that are used by the new multi-use trail will be replaced with new alignments for the horse trails in the park," said Fellbaum. Horses and bicycles don't mix well, so design considerations include "grade change differences and natural vegetation

barriers" that separate the two corridors. "Any crossings of these two corridors will be limited," adds Fellbaum.

The new Maplewood Park segment of the Heart of Lakes Trail is an exciting development for Pelican Rapids, Perham, and surrounding communities. Bike it, walk it, skate it, love it. Nature is waiting for you.

#### It's a Celebration! Friends of Maplewood is a 501(c)3 organization.

Today, we are celebrating an organizational milestone with the news that Friends of Maplewood State Park has been granted 501(c)3 nonprofit status and officially registered as a public charitable organization by the IRS. The status was effective January 8, 2024. Friends of Maplewood State Park previously had a 501(c)3 fiscal agency agreement under the Minnesota Parks and Trails Council but is now registered as a standalone agency.

"The distinction opens many doors for our organization. The exemption makes us eligible for public and private grants. Donors can deduct contributions they make to us, including bequests, transfers, or gifts to Friends of Maplewood State Park," said Scott Stenshoel, President of Friends of Maplewood. Other benefits include organizational exemption from federal, state, and local taxes.

"We are so grateful for the dedicated efforts of our members, our new Board of Directors, our advisory committee, and the volunteers who share their time and talents promoting Maplewood State Park," said Denise Laymon, Vice President. "Friends of Maplewood State Park's future is so bright, and we are anxious to capitalize on our new status."

#### New State Park Interpretive Naturalist position announced at Maplewood / Glendalough State Parks

The Minnesota DNR has announced a new State Park Interpretive Naturalist position to serve at Maplewood and Glendalough State Parks. The position will provide for the interpretive, environmental education, and recreational activities to promote public awareness, appreciation, and understanding of local natural, cultural/archeological, and recreational resources and their management and to foster natural resource stewardship. The area served by this shared position includes Maplewood State Park, Glendalough State Park, and other surrounding MN State Parks & Trails Units.

#### More than 800 people attend Maple Syrup Days!

People have been making syrup from the sap of maple trees for hundreds of years. Maplewood State Park has abundant maple trees, so making syrup makes sense. Minnesota has four predominant native maples that grow large enough to tap for syrup: red, sugar, silver, and boxelder maples. The sugar maple is the favorite for syrup makers because its sap is the sweetest.

To celebrate this natural resource, Friends of Maplewood Maple Syrup Day was held on Saturday, April 13, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. The day started with a pancake feed from 7:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the Event Center in Vergas, Minnesota, hosted by the City of Vergas. From there, folks were invited to Maplewood State Park for demonstrations on making maple syrup at various stations and at the Sugar Shack.

As part of Maple Syrup Days, Friends of Maplewood hosts a series of demonstrations for students and other organizations where attendees can participate in the various stages of syrup-making. Because nature decides when the sap will run, the demonstrations allow us to teach about making syrup anytime. More than 450 students from Underwood, Frazee, Pelican Rapids, Fergus Falls, Detroit Lakes, and Perham attended this year. John Nordstrom, Friends of Maplewood volunteer, coordinated the scheduled events.

#### **Horse Camp Improvements Made!**

You might remember when horse camp was nothing more than a wide-open field. Camping was a free-for-all with only the strong surviving. Since then, many improvements have been made, and many are on our list.

Last year, additional gravel was hauled to improve the road in and out of the horse camp and the main road that runs through it. Archeological studies must be completed before we can move dirt, alter the terrain, or trench for water and electricity. "But we were able to bring in some gravel to minimize the drop-offs on some sites and widen and level roads to make it easier for horse trailers to access campsites," said Jerry Pederson, Friends of Maplewood. Campsite signs should be installed by the time horse camp opens. State Park personnel are hoping to add gravel to the tie sites and fortify those that need it.

"We know there are a lot of improvements that equestrian campers want," said Pederson. We continue to push for those and provide resources where we can." Maplewood Park has over twenty miles of trails, making it some of the best horseback riding in the state.
