The fall colors in Maplewood State Park were astounding this year. Perhaps it was nature's way of saluting retiring Park Manager Don DelGreco.

"I'm an artist. I'm a singer. I'm a biologist. Maybe a poet. Maybe a preacher," added Don Del Greco during his retirement announcement at the Friends of Maplewood annual meeting. Del Greco, long-time Park Manager at Maplewood State Park, is hanging up his park ranger hat after nearly forty years with the MN Department of Natural Resources.

Nearly every morning or evening, Del Greco climbs the Hallaway Hill trail to the overlook on south Lida Laka. When fall approaches, questions about peak leaf day in Maplewood State Park are common. "Peak color is the day you are here," is DelGreco's usual response.

DelGreco is a humble man who takes great joy in serving. "God is calling," he said. "I'm thankful for the gift of living—the gift of preserving natural resources for a new generation."

Del Greco and his wife won't be going far. "Maplewood captured my heart. . . Maplewood is our home."

Del Greco is leaving big shoes to fill. And a hat to match.

Heart of Lakes Trail Update

The Maplewood State Park segment of the Heart of the Lakes Trail in Otter Tail County is progressing rapidly. After weeks of delay earlier in the year, the dry fall helped the contractors make an astonishing amount of progress on the trail. We anticipate that by late fall two-thirds of the bike trail will be paved! It's an incredible feat given that in July we were prepared to finish it next year due to the unrelenting rain! We still have a long road ahead of us but it's shaping up to be a beautiful addition to the park. We hope to have it fully open and ready next summer! The 3.8-mile segment is the final part of the trail to be completed and will connect the Pelican Rapids and Perham segments.

The Heart of the Lakes Regional Trail is a 10-foot-wide, 32-mile-long, multi-use recreational trail that will connect the communities of Perham and Pelican Rapids via Maplewood State Park. The trail is an important component of the state and regional trail system in west central Minnesota and is intended for use by walkers, joggers, bicyclists, dog walkers, inline skaters, and snowmobilers. It provides direct access to several popular lakes and allows users to experience many breathtaking vistas.

"Building and constructing a sustainable trail through Maplewood State Park is a tremendous opportunity to create an outstanding outdoor recreational experience for future generations,"

Dora O'Brien, the Park's new naturalist, "will bring a whole new way of approaching the park," said Don Del Greco. Dora brings a tremendous background in interpretation and a passion for sharing it. A park naturalist educates visitors about nature, including plants, animals, and geological formations. They lead programs and activities like nature walks, campfire talks, and demonstrations. The position will be shared with Glendalough Park.

Dora is originally from Livermore, California, a San Francisco Bay Area town. She spent summers at her family cabin in the Park Rapids area. She attended the College of Saint Benedict in St. Joseph and graduated in 2018 with a degree in environmental studies. After graduation, she moved back to California, working as an interpretive national park ranger intern and local park district naturalist. She is thrilled to be back in Minnesota.


2024 Projects

As 2024 comes to a close, we want our members to know how much we appreciate your support. Membership dues, memorials, and donations go toward events and projects in the park. Looking back on 2024:

- A new well was installed at the Sugar Shack.
- Friends purchased a small utility trailer.
- New hitching posts and more gravel were added to horse campsites.
- We rocked a FULL calendar of four-season events.
- Record attendance at Candlelight Trek and Maple Syrup Days.
- Partnered with Lake Region Electric on their annual meeting. More than 1,000 people attended.
- Defibrillator Donated!
- Evensons of Pelican Rapids provided a large trailer to store our items instead of purchasing a trailer or paying for a storage site.
- Purchased a new refrigerator for the Josh Hanson Memorial Shelter.
- Sugar Shack maple syrup volunteers collected and boiled between 900-1,000 gallons of raw sap, resulting in about 25 gallons of finished/bottled syrup.
- Maple Syrup Education Days resulted in 1,400 visitors!
- Close to 9,000 people visited the park during the Friends' Leaf Days four-day event.
- Friends of Maplewood applied for a grant from the MN Horse Council for phase 1 to install corrals in horse camp. Stay tuned!

The site has a food locker, pit toilet, fire ring, picnic table, and two tent pads." A maximum of six occupants are allowed and the site can be reserved by contacting the park or online. "You'll be on the island by yourself," said Finnegan.
