It was getting dark as they packed up the ladders and scaffolding on December 5th, but it was time and the snow would be arriving that night. How lucky we were that our good weather held until Dave Knopf and a dedicated crew of volunteers were able to finish all the outside work on the Sugar Shack. The shack is now enclosed, insulated and weather tight. Now we can heat the inside, get it wired, put up the metal walls, install the evaporator, and finish off those few other things that need to be done. We will be open for business this 2017 maple sap season. It is exciting for us to realize that this really is going to be done. There were times when we wondered if it would ever happen.

We have some great local contractors who have been there when we needed them. Egge Construction, Gary Wagenman Construction, Lake Region Electric Cooperative, Arntson Electric, Hanson's Plumbing, Stenerson Lumber, Franklin Fence, and of course, the man who makes it all happen, Dave Knopf. Dave is a very conscientious contractor who fit in his work at Maplewood with his other jobs that he had going. Our Sugar Shack is done with great care to every detail.

We have had many volunteers who have worked on the Sugar Shack. Some like Ron Hegerle and Terry Heller spent a lot of time helping Dave. I don't know if Ron missed a single work day. Knowing that I probably missed a couple of people, I counted 24 different people who spent a total of 500 volunteer hours working on the Sugar Shack.

This summer some more finishing touches and landscaping will be completed and then with trumpets and fanfare we will have the ribbon cutting ceremony and turn the keys over to Maplewood State Park. We're going to wait until it is looking completed, but you are welcomed to come visit during the sap season and watch or help the crew at work. 2016 Deer Hunting - Maplewood State Park

Nearly 100 deer hunters participated in the 2016 special deer hunt at Maplewood. The 4-day deer hunt (November 5th -8th) was a good, safe, and wonderful experience for hunters. Unseasonably warm weather with temps in the 60s and near 70s greeted the hunters this year. To manage the deer herd within the park, a special deer hunt has been held each year since the early 1980's. The purpose of the hunt is to protect native plant diversity and restoration efforts from overbrowsing by deer.

Hunters who desire to participate in the park hunt need to apply through the DNR Electronic Licensing System (ELS) in early September. The DNR ELS system issues licenses through 1,500 license agent locations throughout Minnesota or via the DNR Web site at mndnr.gov or via a toll free telephone number (1-888-665-4236). The DNR License Bureau notifies the 100 successful applicants by early October and specific hunt information is sent to each successful applicant. Approximately 370 hunters applied for the 100 available licenses. Unsuccessful applicants will gain a preference point for the next year's lottery. The more preference points a hunter has the better chance at getting drawn. (Successful hunters usually have three or four preference points, which means they had applied for 3 and 4 years).

A total of 52 deer were harvested during the 2016 Special Deer Hunt.

HEADLINE STORIES 2016

As we approach the beauty and wonder of the 2017 winter season at Maplewood we take a quick look back at some "headline story highlights" of 2016.

- <u>-Maplewood sets new Attendance Record in 2016</u>: Over 143,000 visitors enjoyed the wonder of Maplewood in 2016. The previous record was in 2012 when 142,000 guests visited Maplewood State Park. A notable story for the 2016 is the consistent "picture-perfect" weather conditions, especially on weekends, and the long extended fall color season that helped increase park visitation across the Minnesota State Park System. 2016 Horse rider attendance also set a new record with well over 8,000 total riders at Maplewood.
- <u>-2016 winter:</u> Lack of snow and moderately cold weather set the stage for winter anglers, extended hiking opportunities and great winter camping cabin use at Maplewood.
- <u>Maplewood Candlelight Ski Event:</u> Timely snowfall provided "just enough" snow for an excellent and well-attended Friends of Maplewood event.
- <u>-New "You are Here" Trail Map Signs:</u> This project involved the installation of 63 newly designed "You-are-Here" Trail Signs at various locations throughout Maplewood's trail system. Park staff and the Conservation Corps of MN (CCM) also placed the signs at numerous new locations to help park trail users orient themselves to the varied trails of Maplewood.
- <u>-Overhead Electric Power Line Conversion to Underground:</u> Maplewood partnered with LREC (Lake Region Electric Company) to install and convert overhead electrical power lines to underground at Maplewood. This project provides improved long-term access/maintenance of electric power service to the park enhancing aesthetics of the park by removing power poles and power lines from view.
- -<u>Maple syrup season</u> returns to Maplewood: Favorable weather sets stage for an excellent maple syrup season with expanded interpretive programs to Pelican Rapids, Frazee and Underwood Schools.
- <u>- 125th Community Picnic Celebration</u> July 17th- This event attracted guests from throughout the state for a good-old-fashioned picnic with various activities, crafts, yard games, MINNAQUA Fishing Program, and a prairie restoration presentation provided by a corps of Minnesota State Park Naturalists, Friends of Maplewood members and community leaders.
- -New for 2016- Minnesota State Park Customers: In 2016 Minnesota State Parks took steps to modernize our services and better meet customer needs.
 - Minnesota State Parks became 100% Reservable ("guaranteed") campsites for all campgrounds
 - "Same Day" Campsites Reservations with no reservation fee & more self-registration services.
- -Maplewood announces new staff/changes: Please welcome new employee team members:

-<u>School Events:</u> Maplewood hosted numerous local schools' "Year-End" and "Year-Beginning" Events. (Pelican Rapids, Perham, Fergus Falls, Detroit Lakes, Underwood, Frazee/Vergas and others)

- -The Maplewood Sugar Shack Partnership Project continues to move forward. Throughout 2015-16, DNR Parks and Trails staff, DNR architects/engineering staff and Friends of Maplewood Sugar Shack Committee members met several times and have worked closely together to further develop building and site plans for this project. Construction commenced in August with excellent progress being made. This unique partnership has been supported by many generous donations of time, talent and resources. We look forward look to the upcoming developments for this interpretive/educational facility at Maplewood.
- -<u>Legacy Prairie Restoration Auto/Driving Tour Brochures/Signs:</u> This colorful and informational pamphlet is available for park guests to take along with them as they drive through the park to learn about the various sign- marked prairie sites in Maplewood.
- <u>-Prairie restoration resource work continues with several prescribed burns</u> conducted in 2015-16. Favorable weather made for excellent prescribed burn conditions in late October, 2015 & May, 2016.
- -Construction and installation of a new <u>Horse Campground Trail Informational Kiosk:</u> Conservation Corps of MN (CCM)-This project funded through the Minnesota State Horse Pass revenues.
- -MTRA (Minnesota Trail Horse Riders Association) funds were used for 7 new MINNCORR picnic tables for Maplewood's horse camp. (This group annually funds horse camp and day-use area improvements)
- <u>-"MN State Parks & National Parks on the Air" Short-Wave Radio Events:</u> Two local Amateur Radio Operations Units broadcasted from Maplewood in 2016. They joined with MN State Parks and the NPS to celebrate in April, our 125th anniversary and the National Park Service's 100th Anniversary with a transmissions/operations event adjacent to the North Country Trail in Maplewood State Park. Over 270 transmissions spanned the globe, broadcasting the celebration of the park's anniversary with confirmed contacts made to over 40 states (including Hawaii), Guam and Canada.
- <u>-Hallaway Hill Vista Project:</u> Ongoing evaluation and multi-year planning is underway for selecting a new and more sustainable hiking trail route to the top of Hallaway Hill. The modified trail route will take advantage of existing slopes, elevations, and topography and ultimately provide a more sustainable and less erosion-prone route to access the spectacular views from Hallaway Hill.

Plan now to attend the Candlelight Ski at Maplewood State Park. The 1 mile ski trail will be lighted with 150 candles. Come and enjoy the evening. If you don't ski, stand around the campfire, chat with friends,

and enjoy hot chili, bars, and hot drinks. Maplewood State Park has 12 sets of snowshoes that you could try out.

We will have the chili on and ready to serve by 5:00. So come early to Maplewood State Park and ski some of the 8 miles of trails that afternoon. After an hour or so of skiing, come and join the Friends at the Trail Center for supper before going out on the candle lighted trail.

Remember, if you come to go skiing, you do need a Ski Pass. \$6.00 daily ski passes are available at the Park and a 1 year ski pass (\$20) can be purchased at most sport stores [Maplewood can sell them also]. Of course Minnesota Park Stickers are required. Questions can be answered at Maplewood State Park, 218-863-8383. If snow is questionable, call before you come.
