Creativity will probably have to be in motion if we are able to proceed. Hopefully in 2021, we will also be back to being able to produce Maple Syrup and teach students and others all about the process. Stay tuned. We'll let you know.

HISTORY OF THE FRIENDS OF MAPLEWOOD

With nothing going on this past summer at Maplewood that we have to report, I thought I'd take some time to give a little history lesson on our organization.

In October of 1996, the BY-LAWS of the Maplewood State Park Advisory Committee were signed by James McDonald, President and Brent Frazier, secretary, marking the beginning of the Friends of Maplewood. James McDonald was the Mayor of Pelican Rapids and he was very interested in getting a bike trail from Pelican Rapids to Maplewood State Park. Starting this organization was one way of getting support for the bike trail.

The bike trail ran into some opposition and the money that Pelican Rapids had received to build the trail had to be used or given back. It was given back.

In the fall of 2000, I noticed an article in the Pelican Press about an Annual Meeting for the Friends of Maplewood. I'm not sure if this was the first Annual Meeting or just the first one I noticed. I talked my friend Jeff into going with me and at the meeting they asked for volunteers to serve on the Advisory Committee. Again I talked Jeff into joining me on the committee. We had been Boy Scout leaders for many years and camped many times with the boys at Maplewood so we did have an interest.

The first meeting was September 25th, 2000 and we met in the Upper Room of City Hall, above the Jail. Those in attendance were Char Berger, Jim Christianson, Arlen Erickson, Jeff Grunewald, Bob Hanson, Jeff Johnson, John Nordstrom, Wayne Runningen, Cooper Steward, Cyndy Stotesbery, and Tom Voigt.

At our second meeting we decided we needed a chairperson and Tom Voigt was selected as he was absent from the meeting. Our Friends of Maplewood flyer focused around the bike trail from Pelican to Maplewood and being it was not well received we decided to remove that from our flyer. Local people were saying things like, "If you build the bike trail, we'll never shop in Pelican again." Jeff Johnson, who was on our committee and owner of Johnson's Furniture Store, was told that many times.

That was our humble beginning in the year 2000. The Advisory Committee decided we needed a newsletter and the one written in May of 2001 was 2 pages. It highlighted our 1st Candlelight Ski in February which was attended by 30 people and the new entrance sign to Maplewood State Park which was also the first one in the State to be lighted.

We have come a long way in the past 20 years and here are a list of some of the projects that we have helped to accomplish. The projects are great, but I think our best quality is the fun and exciting things we provide for all the visitors to Maplewood, supervised and assisted by our Friends of Maplewood volunteers. I'll include a list of those also.

Parking is getting difficult, but the crowd is very understanding and just seem to have fun. Our volunteers are improving the parking every year.



COVID 19 CARES ACT

Here is an interesting fact about the CARES ACT passed by Congress.

To encourage more charitable giving in 2020, the recently enacted government stimulus bill (the "CARES Act") provides some additional tax relief for donors.

If you take the standard deduction on your 2020 tax return (the one that you'll file in 2021), you can claim a brand new deduction of up to \$300 per taxpayer (\$600 for a married couple). You don't need to itemize to get this donation as there will be a place to reduce your income besides getting the standard deduction. This donation will reduce a donor's adjusted gross income (AGI), and thereby reduce taxable income.

We mention this because maybe you'd like to make an additional monetary donation to the Friends of Maplewood at this time. If so, please make out your check to "Parks and Trails Council of MN" and write Friends of Maplewood in the Memo line. Parks and Trails places the money in our account and the money qualifies for a 501c3 donation as we piggy back on their account. They receive none of the donation for helping us and we use the money whenever it is needed.

So think about an additional donation to the Friends of Maplewood. Thanks in advance.

When you think about Maplewood, you have to think about Jeff Fjestad. When he graduated from high school in Pelican Rapids in1995, he started working at Maplewood the next day. So for 25 years he has worked at Maplewood with his last position as Assistant Park Manager. Yes I said last position because he doesn't work there any more. As of March 25th he started a new position with the Parks and Trails of Minnesota. His new position is Area 1B Supervisor and his office is in Fergus Falls.

This opportunity was a good fit for Jeff because it allowed him to become a Full Time employee for the first time and he did not have to relocate. He supervises a staff of 8 that maintains 250+ public water accesses in 7 counties as well as 14 fishing piers. They also maintain 55 miles of the State Bike Trail from Fergus Falls to Osakis, and three State Water Trails: Long Prairie water trail, Red River water trail, and the Otter Tail water trail.

When he started in Fergus Falls at the Parks and Trails Office he only got to put in 2 days and because of Covid 19 was sent off to work from home. He enjoys the challenges of a new job, but does miss many things about working at Maplewood. Oh don't worry Jeff, you'll have many days at Maplewood volunteering with the Friends of Maplewood.

Working from home was good as his wife Tracy was due to have a baby and they had to be careful. On June 19, Hope Sydney Fjestad was born. They now have 2 girls, Harper and Hope. Congratulations to the Fjestads on their new baby and Jeff's new job. We wish them the best.


Elroy Backstrom
